Report of the 3rd Asia Pacific Expert Workshop on Psychosocial Factors at Work

The 3rd Asia Pacific Expert Workshop on Psychosocial Factors at Work was held on 3rd-4th August 2012 in The University of Tokyo, Japan, chaired by Dr. Akihito Shimazu (Associate Professor, The University of Tokyo). This workshop followed the previous successful two workshops, which had been held in Darwin in 2010 and in Johor Bahru in 2011.

In the previous two workshops, experts from Australia, New Zealand, Malaysia, and Japan constituted the network. This year, this network has been expanded with new experts from China, Korea, and Thailand. In total, 22 experts from 8 countries (including Germany and France), 16 members of local organizing committee in Japan, and 5 volunteers from Japan participated in the workshop.

The program consisted of a keynote address, a keynote workshop, 18 oral presentations, 7 poster presentations, and round-table discussion (See Appendix for the content of the program). In the keynote address, Prof. Norito Kawakami (The University of Tokyo) talked about research and practice in psychosocial factors at work in Asia. In the keynote workshop, Dr. Kazuhiro Yoshiuchi (Associate Professor, The University of Tokyo) talked about the applications of computerized ecological momentary assessment in behavioral medicine research with small group discussion. In the round-table discussion, participants chose one of the following three topics and participate in a relevant group for the discussion: (1) Bridging research and practice, (2) Education and training for psychosocial factors at work, and (3) Innovations in work stress theory, research, and practice. A coordinator from each group presented the summary of the discussion in the final report to develop the overall future research agenda.




